Visions & Voices Playwriting Showcase brings staged readings of fresh, funny and exhilarating short plays by local youth to the Ellyn Bye Studio

The future of playwriting will be on display at The Armory during the Visions & Voices Showcase on May 15 and 16 at 7:00 p.m. These free public performances in the Ellyn Bye Studio will feature professional actors performing staged readings of plays and monologues written by local high school students

who participated in Portland Center Stage at The Armory's Visions & Voices education program. Each year, these showcases delight audiences with readings that are honest, funny, moving and exhilarating. Works by students from schools such as Cleveland High School, Franklin High School, Liberty High School, Lincoln High School, Sam Barlow High School, Sunset High School and Wilson High School will be debuted.

"Visions & Voices provides a platform upon which students may explore ideas and investigate their world through theater — free of censorship and always with permission to take daring, artistic risks," said The Armory's Resident Teaching Artist Matthew B. Zrebski. "In having the opportunity to witness their creations brought to life by professional actors in a public forum," he continued, "students are given the rare opportunity to fully engage with their work as it intersects with the most important and final collaborator in the art form: the audience."

VISIONS & VOICES

The Visions & Voices program brings professional teaching artists into local high schools for intensive, month-long playwriting and performance residencies. Designed to meet Oregon's Benchmarks for Arts and English/Language Arts, the program introduces students to theatrical conventions, dramatic structure, acting, writing and constructive critical response. Ultimately, Visions & Voices provides an outlet for local youth to express their ideas, passions and desires; and to explore difficult questions, exercise empathy, and embrace the chaos that is "growing up." The program culminates each season with a showcase featuring staged readings of selected student scripts. Up to six Visions & Voices graduates are also chosen to participate in JAW: A Playwrights Festival, which is recognized nationally for its role in developing new works for the stage. Portland Center Stage at The Armory has been offering the Visions & Voices program for the past 18 years.

PORTLAND CENTER STAGE AT THE ARMORY

Portland Center Stage at The Armory is the largest theater company in Portland and among the top 20 regional theaters in the country. Established in 1988 as a branch of the Oregon Shakespeare Festival, the company became independent in 1994 and has been under the leadership of Artistic Director Chris Coleman since 2000. Around 150,000 visitors attend The Armory annually to enjoy a mix of classical, contemporary and world premiere productions, along with a variety of high quality education and community programs. 11 productions are offered each season, in addition to roughly 400 community events created — in partnership with 170+ local organizations and individuals — to serve the diverse populations in the city. As part of its dedication to new play development, the company has produced 23 world premieres and presents an annual new works festival, JAW: A Playwrights Festival. Home to two theaters, The Armory was the first building on

the National Register of Historic Places, and the first performing arts venue, to achieve a LEED Platinum rating.
